# QUICK GUIDE

The purpose of this template is to describe your legacy focus and desired impact as specific and concrete as possible with the problem owner in focus. Remember to still keep the focus a bit open so you can invite stakeholders or other relevant people to join the project and let them be creative. You will use the boxes to map important insights and knowledge you have. Step by step you will become more specific on your focus area and more clear on your desired impact. By the end, you should have the backbone for writing the challenge as a question that can lead up a brainstorming session.

- **1.** Work through the boxes from 1-9 and use the guiding questions to map the knowledge and insights you each have.
- 2. When you get to box 9 you will come up with an openended question that sums up the challenge you are trying to solve.

Use the following formula to formulate your question:

How might we (intended action) For (Problem owner)

So that (Desired impact)

Make sure that the question is not too broad or too narrow.

Come up with multiple versions of your question before you decide. Pick the one that seems most relevant and most inspiring.


